Implement the following Protective Measures at all times.
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Minimising contact with individuals who are unwell 2. Cleaning hands more often than usual - wash hands thoroughly for 20 seconds 3. Ensuring good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach 4. Cleaning frequently touched surfaces often 5. Minimising contact and mixing, including social distancing.

COVID -19 – Amendments to the Behaviour policy. All pupils and staff will follow the new guidance

Children will have to behave differently when they return to school, the following rules must be followed:

- All parents and pupils must follow any altered routines for arrival or departure at the school gate. Information will be provided before the first day of opening and will be in place until further notice.
- Parents, Carers and Visitors will not be allowed into the school unless specifically invited by the Headteacher. Our preferred method of communication will be telephone or email.
- Pupils must follow school instructions on hygiene, such as handwashing and sanitising.
- Pupils will have a defined classroom and permitted areas in the school to ensure social distancing as far as possible.
- When moving around the school specific instructions must be followed (for example, one-way systems, out of bounds areas, queuing).
- There are expectations about sneezing and coughing. Tissues will be provided and the school will adopt the ‘catch it, bin it, kill it’ campaign and will be encouraged to avoid touching the mouth, nose and eyes with hands.
- Pupils must tell an adult if they are unwell so that staff can ascertain if they are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus. Pupils will then have to go home (parents will be contacted) and remain at home following self-isolation rules
- Pupils will not share any equipment or other items including drinking bottles
- There will be amended expectations about breaks and play times, including where children may or may not play
- Specific toilets will be allocated to classes
- Coughing or spitting at or towards any other person will not be tolerated and pupils will be sent home and discussions regarding their future attendance will be had with their Headteacher.

Due to the fact we can not bring children out of their rooms into other spaces, any children not following the rules will be sent home and parents must collect them from Main Office
